

PEER SUPPORT SUPERVISION TRAINING

Course Structure:

Topics Covered:

Module 1: Understanding the Role of a Peer Support Worker: Delve into core elements of peer roles and explore how this profession utilizes service approaches in supportive connections

Module 2: Understanding the Peer Program Supervisor Role: Define key responsibilities, challenges, and opportunities inherent to this position

Module 3: Knowledge and Skills Application: Practice applying supervisory skills to scenarios to foster environments in which peer service offerings can thrive

The content is designed to be interactive, offering opportunities to:

- Review foundational concepts related to effective leadership in peer services
- Explore techniques tailored to support the needs of Peer Support Workers in a variety of workplace settings
- Engage in skill-building related to communication, conflict resolution, and performance feedback to encourage ongoing growth
- Bridge theory and practice by applying training content to scenarios you may encounter in a leadership role
